



Axis 1 – IOD Methodology

To replicate and adapt to the Portuguese reality, the already teste methodology – in France and Belgium

Innovative methodology (sustainable idea, replicable, scale), alternative solution (more effective) regarding the traditional approaches of Job Centres

Empowerment and non-discriminatory regarding target audiences

IMPACT:

Increase of longlasting work for disadvantaged groups

Reduction of recruitment and selection and of the companies' turnover

Reduction of public expenditure vis-à-vis other policies

Axis 2 – New Model of WISE

Economically productive structures (managed in a sustainable manner) in different sectors of economic activity which offer:

- 1. Working mechanisms that might combine different responses for integration (accordingly to the variables and contexts):
 - Responses of integration for the regular labour market
 - -Permanent employment
- 2. Training in a real work context (non-formal education methodologies) (namely <u>IOD</u>; certification of qualification)
